

# **SKATOPIA.** 88 Acres of Anarchy. (1)

Skatopia: 88 Acres of Anarchy is a feature documentary that follows one of skateboarding's most infamous figures. Mercurial skateboarder Brewce Martin is the self-declared "dictator" of a rural Appalachian skate scene so extreme that MTV's bad-boy Bam Margera fled the property on his first visit.

For ten years, Brewce and a volunteer army of skaters and hillbillies have worked to build a "sovereign nation" in Appalachia free from society's rules. The movie follows Brewce through an obstacle strewn year as his radical twist on the American dream is challenged by bill collectors, a rag-tag labor force and an unexpected stint in the regional jail. Though he declares skating his "prime directive", the film reveals a fiercely driven entrepreneur determined to achieve success on his own terms.

Brewce Martin gave the filmmakers total access to his life and to Skatopia during the filming. They lived on-location for a year.

### Logline:

Mercurial skateboarder Brewce Martin has built a "sovereign nation" in Appalachia free from society's rules, but his radical twist on the American dream is challenged by bill collectors, a rag-tag labor force and an unexpected stint in the regional jail.

### **Medium Synopsis:**

Skatopia is an Appalachian farm where hardcore skating, punk rock and hillbilly culture collide. Skatopia's owner, Brewce Martin, dreamed of a place where he could live and breathe skating... a place where people forget their "outside" lives by plunging into high-energy craziness.

"Dictator Brewce" presides over the mayhem like a modern-day Jim Jones. To keep building new skate terrain, he relies on free labor from local hillbillies and traveling skaters. Visitors to the farm often stay for months to work and skate, many of them searching for an alternative to a society that leaves them numb.

In early 2006, Brewce hatches a grand slew of plans to expand the skatepark. Skatopia is his chance at greatness, and after ten years of non-stop hustling, he desperately wants it to be a sustainable business and a monument to skateboarding.

His infectious optimism persists even as misfortunes pile on. But with an unexpected stay in jail, it looks as if the year's potential is lost. Brewce's relationship with his 20 year old son Brandon is put to a test when Brandon is forced to run the farm. Soon the fun of running a fun-loving place is peeled away, and the challenge of building a dream becomes clear.

The movie celebrates the freedom from everyday life that Skatopia offers, but it also takes a hard look at the flip side of Brewce's energy and charisma. No story book hero, Brewce can switch from inspiring visionary to bullying cult-leader in seconds. But his fierce pursuit of his dream will inspire even those who have never touched a skateboard.

**Brewce Martin:** Pro-skater famous for competing in skate contests naked. The "Dictator" of Skatopia runs the farm with a velvet fist.



**Brandon Martin:** Home-schooled on the 88 acre farm. Burned his first car at age 12. Hopes to take over Skatopia one day.



**Halo Whitelight:** Queen of Skatopia. Mother of Brewce's baby daughter. A natural on a skateboard, but doesn't always see eye to eye with Brewce.



**Nick McKnight:** Hard drinking, smart-ass Skatopia mechanic. Keeps everything on the farm moving 'til it's time to burn it. Watches the farm when Brewce is away.



**Micah Friedman:** Train hopping traveler looking to go back to the land at Skatopia. Willing to argue with Brewce about the right way to live.

Colin Powers is the Managing Partner, Producer, Director, and Writer at Headlamp Pictures. He is also the Director of Production & Programming at Mountain Lake PBS in Plattsburgh, NY where he executive produces three series, two documentaries and a broad range of local productions.

He has written non-fiction screenplays for A&E Biography and American Movie Classics. He has worked as a freelance field producer and staff associate producer / researcher for A&E Biography, American Movie Classics and independent productions.

Prior to filmmaking, Colin worked as General Manager and Manager of Research and Development at Burley Design Cooperative, a \$10 million/year worker-owned bicycle factory in Eugene, Oregon. Colin has a degree in Geography from the University of California at Berkeley.

# **Director's Statement.** (5)

Early on in the shooting of our documentary "Skatopia: 88 Acres of Anarchy", our main subject, Brewce Martin, turned the camera on me and asked "The real question here is, how did your husband convince you to move down to this backwater and make a film about testosterone fueled mayhem and an egotistical asshole?"

But Brewce's hopes for his life: personal freedom, elbow room, the desire to do what he loves and to feel alive are universal. He lives out things that we fear to – whether because they're not politically correct or even because they actually would ruin our life as we know it.

I wanted to force the audience to ask themselves: Are they getting what they want from their lives? How do we live life to the hilt? Does risking your life mean you're stupid? Or does it make you more alive? How much money can you make off of society without becoming part of it? Why do we need our visionaries to be perfect humans?

Both Brewce and Skatopia help us wrestle with these questions by preventing us from falling into easy categories of good people and bad people. One visiting skater-drummer writes software programs for NASA. The most polite kid on the farm is Brewce's own 17 year old son, whom Brewce raised and homeschooled at Skatopia. Punk kids (read "slacker" by society's standards) come out and dig in the mud all day to build new skate terrain. And Brewce, an infamous bad-boy skater, spent 10 years building a multimillion dollar skate park using only donations and volunteer labor from traveling skaters and local hillbillies.

Brewce's passion and persistence are the real story in this film. And ultimately, the underlying "mission" of Brewce's life and of the film is to encourage us to ask ourselves how we can tap that kind of passion in our own lives.

# **Action So Far.** (6)

The film opened its preview screenings by selling out the Tribeca Cinemas in NYC in July 2009. The show attracted mainstream media like Rolling Stone and Newsweek, skate mags and blogs including Juice, RadCollector, Slap and Concrete Wave. The after-party sponsored by Pabst brought Skatopia alive for a fan base that trekked from a dozen plus states.

Followup screenings in Denver, Seattle, Amsterdam and Hot Springs, AR brought reviews from newspapers and alternative weeklies. The film got the unnofficial "most enthusiastic audience" award in Denver after packing the theater and another sponsored after-party.
